

20 high schoolers honored as 1985's outstanding youths

RANDOLPH — The Randolph Jaycees last night honored 20 high school students with their 1985 Outstanding Youth Award.

The winners, including five repeaters from last year, were chosen by a seven-judge panel of Jaycees from 104 applicants nominated by school, religious and community leaders.

The choice was made on the basis of scholastic achievement, community service and demonstrated leadership qualities.

The second annual awards were presented in ceremonies in the high school auditorium.

School board Chairman Michael Bower, who also headed the awards committee, praised the youths. "The young people of this town have offered a lot to this community and it is time that the town and groups like the Jaycees started to pay these young people back for the good that they do," he said.

Student winner Ajit Gokhale said,

"I'm glad that the Jaycees recognize people who take part in community activities."

Speakers included state Rep. John Flood, D-Canton; state Rep. M. Joseph Manning, D-Milton; Jaycees President Bill Good; school Superintendent John Zoino; high school Principal Philip Saba; school committee Vice Chairman Brenda Berger; and Selectmen Chairman Maureen Dunn.

The winners received certificates from the Jaycees and citations from Flood. Their names will be engraved on a plaque to be displayed at the high school, the library and other municipal buildings.

Following is a list of the winners:

Michelle Margaret Aldred: A senior, Aldred was ranked 19th in her class. She has a brown belt in karate, is an assistant karate instructor and a dancer. Aldred has taught religious education, and has been a member of the chorus and drama club. She was a French tutor and president of the French Club.

Winne Chu: A junior, Chu has been on the honor roll each term. She is a member of the color guard and will be a tri-captain next year. She has been a student council member for two years and is the

school's representative to the Greater Boston Student Advisory Council. She was a 1985 National History Day project winner. She belongs to the French and drama clubs, Students Against Driving Drunk, and is a French tutor.

Patrice Marie Earley: A senior, Earley is ranked 21 in her class and received a Commonwealth Scholarship grant. She has been a tutor in algebra and Spanish, worked in the school library and as a student adviser. She is a member of the Spanish and language clubs, and worked on the school newspaper. She also has volunteered at Cardinal Cushing Hospital and at Turner Free Library.

Joan Katherine Falvey: A junior, Falvey has been class president for three years, a member of the student school committee, and is co-chairperson of Students Against Driving Drunk. An honor student, she won a Jaycees Outstanding Youth Award last year. She teaches ceramics, is a member of the Bay State Bicycle Club and has won two local races.

Steven Michael Glazerman: A junior, Glazerman is in the top two percent of his class. He has been a student council member for three years, and performs in the marching, concert and stage bands, and the jazz ensemble. Glazerman is treasurer of the drama club. He has also been on the soccer and math teams.

Ajit Vasant Gokhale: The top-ranked senior student, Gokhale has played baseball throughout high school. He was junior class treasurer and was on the student council for three years. He was on the math team for two years and was captain one year. He received math and science awards, and has belonged to the chess club, French club and newspaper staff.

Bruce David Harrington: A senior, Harrington

has an uncorrectable eye disability which renders him legally blind, but will graduate in the top 15 percent of his class. The junior assistant Scoutmaster of the Boy Scout troop at St. Bernadette's Church, he is working on his Eagle Scout project. He has coached in the North Randolph Little League for two years. He is a student adviser, a member of the computer club and St. Bernadette's CYO.

Kathleen B. Hines: A senior, she is ranked sixth in the Class of 1985. A member of the school band for three years, she has performed with area music groups, including one at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. An honor roll student, she belongs to the National Honor Society, Spanish Club and student newspaper staff, and has served on the student council. She received a letter of commendation in the National Merit Scholarship program.

Laurie Beth Kaufman: A senior, Kaufman was class president for four years and captain of the gymnastics team for three years, winning a spot on two all-star teams. A cheerleader for four years, she was a semi-finalist in the state homecoming queen contest. She is a member of the National Honor Society, Students Against Driving Drunk and received a 1984 outstanding youth award.

Mark Evan Kaufmann: A senior, Kaufmann is the second-ranked student in the class. A student council member for four years, he was its president this year. A member of the band for four years, he performed in regional and all-state bands each year. He has received two awards for math and science studies, was on the track team for two years and won a 1984 outstanding youth award.

Samara Julie Kopelman: A senior, Kopelman is ranked ninth in the class. She was in the school band

and show choir for four years, directed "Showcase '84," and is music director for Avon Community Theater. She has been an organist at St. Mary's Church and worked with area music groups. She was a 1984 outstanding youth award recipient.

Christine Lennon: A senior, Lennon is ranked 18th in her class. She has been class treasurer, a cheerleader, and a member of the drama club and select chorus for four years. She was chosen to participate in a regional music festival for four years and belongs to Students Against Driving Drunk. She has worked as a volunteer at Milton Hospital and was a 1984 outstanding youth award recipient.

Cindy Gail Levine: A senior, Levine is ranked third in her class and received a Superintendent's Award for academic excellence. She has been a member of the drama club for four years and participated in figure skating competitions for two years. She has worked in two political campaigns.

Carolyn Joy Livingston: A senior, Livingston has been an honor roll student for four years. She has been a member of the drama club for four years, and a math and Spanish tutor for two years. She has done volunteer work at Brockton Hospital, Boston School for the Deaf and a local pre-school.

Greta Marcus: A junior, Marcus is a black belt in karate and won top honors in state competition. She is secretary of the Spanish club, and has been a member of the swim and tennis teams, student council and marching band. She is in the top 15 percent of her class. She volunteers at Holywell Nursing Home and won a 1984 outstanding youth award.

Jamie Lynne Rosenthal: A senior, she is ranked 22 in her class. She has been a member of

the band and treasurer for four years, and is a flute player for Suburban Singers, a charitable group. She has been a cheerleader, a member of the student council advisory board and the school newspaper staff. She was awarded a certificate in French.

Elisa Jill Rubin: A senior, Rubin is ranked fourth in her class. She has been a member of the drama club for four years and produced the club's 1985 drama festival play. She was a member of the Students Against Driving Drunk and was a student adviser for two years. She has taken dance classes for 11 years.

Stuart C. Schoenfeld: A senior, Schoenfeld has been an honor roll student for four years. He has worked in volunteer capacities for local programs of Randolph Cablesystems, from an original mini-series to live broadcasts of school committee meetings. He won second prize in the Randolph Art Association's 1984 water color competition.

Linda Marie Wilkins: A senior, she will graduate in the top 15 percent of the class. She has been class vice president, and a cheerleader for four years. She is a dance and aerobics instructor, and has won many dance awards. She has been a member of two drum and bugle corps, the drama club for two years and was choreographer of "Showcase '85." She won an outstanding youth award last year.

Elyse Heidi Wolrich: A junior, she has been an honor roll student for three years. She won a scholarship for study abroad and has been on the newspaper staff for three years. She has been involved in the color guard flag team, drama club and Students Against Driving Drunk. She has been a volunteer at Cardinal Cushing Hospital and was an outstanding youth award recipient last year.
